



Every day we care for 105 children in our childcare center, more than 1,100 seniors checked in over 14,000 times for SilverSneakers last year, and we have more than 15,000 participants in programs of all kinds



During times of great need in the community, we serve as a resting place, food distribution hub and vital community resource. For example, since 2020 over **3 million pounds** of food were provided to local families from the Emergency Food Pantry (in partnership with Emergency Food Pantry network)
