

Extra-voted Millages Total 2025 Tax Revenues

The amount of taxes paid by a property owner is based on the taxable value of the home and property.

Taxes are levied twice each year – summer and winter. Taxes collected in 2024 fund operations in 2025.

Summer Taxes

(General operating millage)

4.8955 mills

Tax rate

If your home's taxable value is \$100,000, you'll pay

Winter Taxes

(Extra-voted millages)

5.735 mills


